**JBMDL LAKEHURST SECTION HUNTING, FISHING, TRAPPING AND BOATING
ACTIVITIES**

This Operation Instruction (OI) is in direct conjunction with the Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst Instruction 32-7064: Hunting, Fishing, Trapping and Boating on JB MDL.

The purpose of this OI is to administer hunting, fishing, trapping and boating activities in the Lakehurst Section (LKE) on Joint Base McGuire Dix Lakehurst (JB MDL). The LKE Section hunting areas are open for hunting, fishing, trapping and boating activities when not in use for training.

1. OVERVIEW:

1.1 Program Management: JB MDL hunting, fishing, trapping and dispersed outdoor recreation programs are appropriate when they are consistent with the Installation Natural Resources Management Plan (INRMP) goals for natural resources management. Fish and game harvests must comply with all federal and state laws and regulations, and will be consistent with Department of Defense (DoD) principles for ecosystem management and biodiversity conservation. The designated installation natural resources manager is responsible for direction and oversight of hunting and fishing programs and approving all expenditures of user fees collected under the authority of this instruction.

1.2 Hunting, training hunting dogs, fishing, trapping and boating on JB MDL are privileges. These privileges will be granted only as long as participants abide by this instruction. This operational instruction specifically applies to the section of JB MDL that was within the boundaries of the former Naval Air Engineering Station Lakehurst. This instruction is intended to provide a high quality outdoor recreational experience and to protect, conserve and manage the wildlife on the installation. The safety of all personnel using this installation for military training and recreational activities is of paramount importance.

2. ELIGIBILITY:

2.1 Participant Categories: The following categories of participants are recognized when discussing varying levels of access to installation lands and cost of base permits:

Active Duty Military, E-1 through E-4/Dependents, Active Duty Military E5-E9/Dependents, Active Duty Officer/Dependents, Retired Military, Disabled Veterans

with NJ Disabled Veteran License, DoD Civilians/Dependents, Retired DoD Civilians, Guest Hunters and Fishermen, Fishermen (including over 69) and Youth Hunter.

3. HUNTING AND FISHING PERMITS:

3.1 All persons desiring to hunt or fish on the installation must possess the required New Jersey license for that activity.

3.2 JB MDL hunting permits will be valid from July 1 each year until June 30 of the following year. JB MDL fishing permits will be valid from January 1 to December 31 of each year. Permit fees are established by the Natural Resources office in consultation with the NAF Council. Permits will be available for purchase no later than 48 hours after the completion of the first scheduled safety brief. All JB MDL hunting and fishing permits on the Lakehurst section are available for purchase from the i-Sportsman website at [https:// www.jbmdl.isportsman.net](https://www.jbmdl.isportsman.net). For further information, telephone 732- 323-2911. A hunting permit is required to hunt, train hunting dogs or scout for game on JB MDL. Individuals who wish to hunt on the Lakehurst section of JB MDL must attend a mandatory safety brief each year BEFORE they can purchase the base hunting permit. The installation hunting permit purchased from i-Sportsman will be valid for the Dix section of JB MDL. However, individuals wishing to hunt in the Dix Cantonment Area/McGuire (DCAM) on the Dix and McGuire sections of JB MDL or in the Dix Range Area (DRA) MUST ATTEND a separate mandatory DCAM or DRA safety brief each year before they can hunt in either of those areas. The installation fishing permit purchased from i-Sportsman will be valid for the Dix section of JB MDL. Military and civilian dependents under the age of 16 do not need a permit to fish on the installation.

3.3 A New Jersey State trout stamp is not required to fish for trout on JB MDL.

3.4 The JB MDL hunting and fishing permit fee schedule will be approved by the installation commander. The current fee information to hunt, fish or trap on JB MDL can be found at gomdl.com or by calling Outdoor Recreation at 609-562-4211.

4. TRAPPING

4.1 Trapping is permitted on JB MDL with a special permit memorandum issued by the Natural Resources office. Trappers must have a valid New Jersey trapping license. After obtaining the memorandum, trappers can purchase the base permit from the i-Sportsman website. The trapping permit fee will be waived for trappers who are requested to trap problem species on JB MDL using the New Jersey Site Specific Permits or Depredation Permits.

5. HUNTING

5.1 Hunter Safety Briefing: Every person hunting, training dogs or scouting for game on JB MDL will have a current JB MDL hunting permit. Prior to obtaining a hunting permit, all hunters shall receive an annual hunters' safety briefing given by the JB MDL Lakehurst Rod and Gun Club or the Natural Resources Manager. Briefings for club members and sponsored

hunters will be held at the regular August and September club meetings which are held on the third Monday of each month at 1700 hours. Additional briefings may be scheduled as needed. Other briefings will be arranged for special cases such as recently assigned military personnel and those coming off long TDY deployments. For further information telephone 732-323-2911.

5.2 Permit: The installation hunting permit purchased from i-Sportsman will be valid for the Lakehurst section of JB MDL ONLY after the permit holder has attended the mandatory safety brief and obtained the additional validation code for the Lakehurst section of JB MDL. A hunter may purchase a JB MDL hunting permit from i-Sportsman after receiving a validation code within 48 hrs. of attending the Lakehurst section safety brief. A n y hunter holding a JB MDL hunting permit who is hunting on a section of the base without the appropriate safety brief validation on their permit is hunting illegally and subject to appropriate penalties as shown in enclosure 2. Permits purchased from i-Sportsman can only be successfully purchased AFTER the applicant has been certified as having attended the appropriate safety brief. The base hunting permit, once purchased, will be carried by the hunter and displayed on the back of outer clothing at all times while hunting. Hunting permits are not transferable. At the time of application, the hunter shall show a current New Jersey hunting license and proof of identification. Hunters who are not members of the Lakehurst Rod and Gun Club are restricted to hunting ONLY in Hunting Areas 1 and 2 as shown in enclosure 3. This restriction applies to all Lakehurst-eligible hunters who purchased base permits from i-Sportsman if they did not put in the mandatory 4 hours of work on the Lakehurst section of the base. Lakehurst Rod and Gun Club members must contribute 4 hours of labor to various conservation projects each year in order to maintain their club membership. Hours shall be verified by club officers, committee chairs or the natural resources manager. If the club member does not work the mandatory 4 hours before the beginning of the hunting season, he/she will be restricted to hunting only in Areas 1 and 2 as shown in enclosure 3.

5.3 Bag Limits/Seasons: All federal and New Jersey bag limits and gender restrictions for deer and other game will apply to the Lakehurst section (NJ Deer Management Zone 53) of JB MDL unless changes have been officially authorized by the New Jersey Division of Fish and Wildlife or the United States Fish and Wildlife Service. Bag limits may be reduced and hunting seasons may be reduced or cancelled by the Natural Resources Office in order to promote military mission or wildlife management objectives unique to JB MDL. There is NO hunting on JB MDL for bobwhite quail, ruffed grouse or woodcock.

5.4 Sponsored Hunting: Due to increased security requirements, hunting access to the Lakehurst section of JB MDL for members of the general public who are unaffiliated with DoD is limited to those who can be sponsored by JB MDL Lakehurst Rod and Gun Club members. The “sponsored hunting” will be conducted as follows:

5.4.1 Sponsors: Any regular member of the JB MDL Lakehurst Rod and Gun Club 18 years and older may sponsor members of the general public (“guests”) to hunt on the Lakehurst section of JB MDL. Dependent members of the JB MDL Lakehurst Rod and Gun Club are not eligible to sponsor guest hunters. A qualifying individual may sponsor a maximum of two guests per year.

5.4.2 Guest Permit: A guest hunter may purchase their permit from i-Sportsman, after signing the Liability/Hold Harmless Agreement digitally. Purchase of hunting permit does not allow base access without appropriate sponsorship. Any sponsored guest must be

a United States citizen and provide proof of same. State hunting licenses are still required before one may purchase a base hunting permit.

5.4.3 Hunting Procedure: The sponsor must meet the guest at the front gate and accompany the guest at all times when the guest goes hunting on JB MDL. "Accompany" is defined as the guest and the sponsor hunting in Hunting Areas 1 and 2, as shown in Enclosure 3. Since the guests will not be members of the JB MDL Lakehurst Rod and Gun Club, they are still restricted to the Conservation Area which is Hunting Areas 1 and 2. If the guest is found hunting without the sponsor being signed in at Building 525 AND hunting in Areas 1 or 2, both parties will be subject to penalties outlined in Enclosure 2.

5.4.4 Substitute Sponsors: Guest hunters may hunt with a "substitute sponsor" other than their own if that substitute sponsor does not have more than one of his/her usual guests hunting that day. In this circumstance, the substitute sponsor assumes all sponsorship responsibilities for the actions of the hunter for whom they substitute sponsor that day.

5.4.5 Base Access: The base hunting permit is NOT an access pass to the base. It only allows the guest to hunt legally on JB MDL. Access to the base will be granted only if the guest is accompanied by the sponsor or a substitute sponsor who only has a maximum of one other sponsored guest hunting at that time.

5.5 Hunter Registration Board: All hunters must log in at the Hunter Registration Board located at Building 525. Hunters may sign in for a maximum of two hunting areas at a time. Trappers are NOT restricted to this 2 area maximum. Trappers may sign in for all zones being checked on their trap line. Hunters will proceed, via the marked route, directly to the hunting areas shown on enclosure 3. Hunting for non-club members is allowed only in the Conservation Area (Hunting Areas 1 and 2). Immediately after leaving their hunting area, hunters must log out at Building 525 and record the amount and type of game harvested. Parking on base property and/or signing in/out at Bldg. 525 for purposes of hunting off base is strictly prohibited.

5.6 Buildings, Magazine, Taxiways, Towways and Test Tracks. Hunting and/or carrying a loaded firearm within 450 feet of a building or hunting and/or carrying a bow or crossbow with a knocked arrow within 450 feet of a school or playground or within 150 feet of a non-school building is prohibited. The exceptions are Building 564, the Bass Lake lean-to and the Trap Range building. Hunting is also prohibited in: any locations designated on the hunting map (enclosure 3) as No Hunting areas; within 450 feet of the magazine; within 750 feet of the centerline of any runways or taxiways, excluding Taxiway (Towway) 4; within 750 feet of the Test Tracks; within 200 feet of the pavement edge of Towways 4, Taxiway 4 (aka "D") and 11 the crossing of runways, runway clear zones, test site clear zones or test tracks is strictly prohibited. Hunting is prohibited in any of the cleared/partially cleared areas along any runway/taxiway. Under no circumstances shall a weapon be discharged within 1000 feet in the direction of an operational aircraft whether taxiing, in flight or parked.

5.7 Start Times: Small game and pheasant hunting shall commence no earlier than 0800 hours on opening day and 0730 thereafter. All hunters must sign-out at the hunter registration board NLT one (1) hour after sunset. Deer hunting shall commence in accordance with legal shooting hours as specified by NJ hunting regulations. Hunters are not exempt from the requirement of any federal or state laws governing licenses and

stamps while hunting on the Lakehurst section of JB MDL, with the exception of the New Jersey Pheasant Stamp, which is not required. However, payment of a base pheasant hunting fee on the i-Sportsman website is required prior to hunting pheasants on the Lakehurst section of JB MDL.

5.8 No Hunting Periods: With the exception of Spring turkey season, hunting is prohibited between March 16 and 31 August. It is the responsibility of the hunter to determine when the bow and arrow season begins. Other hunting seasons, (i.e., September Canada goose season) when offered by New Jersey regulations may be authorized. Small game and pheasant hunting is prohibited on Permit Shotgun Day(s). From March 16 to opening day of Fall bow season, hunting areas are open seven days a week to JB MDL permit holding sportsmen for game scouting and hunting dog training. Game scouting and hunting dog training are also permitted on Sundays throughout the hunting season. All hunting dogs must be properly licensed in accordance with NJ state law and have all vaccinations up to date. Signing in/out at the hunter registration board at Building 525 is REQUIRED for these activities.

5.9 Deer Stands: Permanent deer stands are prohibited on all sections of JB MDL. Existing permanent stands must be removed by the owner. Permanent deer stands are defined as construction materials attached to trees with screws or nails that cannot be easily removed on a daily basis. JB MDL reserves the right to have final interpretive authority over what constitutes a “permanent” deer stand. Hunters are limited to three deer stands for the entire base. All stands must have the owner’s name printed on bottom and be readable from the ground or have an identification tag on the ladder. All deer stands left in the woods overnight must be tagged with the owner’s permit number for that year. Deer stands may not be placed in the woods until four weeks prior to Fall bow season. All deer stands must be removed from the woods within thirty days after the conclusion of Winter bow season.

5.9.1 Safety Harness for Deer Stands: Safety belts/harness must be used when hunting from an elevated stand/position. Hunters are required to use a full-chest safety harness when hunting from an elevated stand. It shall be equipped with a quick release or be configured in such a manner that it won’t choke or restrict breathing if used. Belt straps do not meet this requirement.

5.9.2 Tree Cutting, Trimming, and Pruning: Trees may be trimmed and pruned to ensure clear shooting lanes from stands/blinds. No trees greater than 2” in diameter (measured at 4 ½ feet above the ground) shall be cut down to improve shooting lanes. Hunters are responsible to ensure stands/blinds are placed to minimize the disturbance to surrounding areas.

5.10 Deer Feeders: No deer feeding device shall be placed within 200 feet of any paved road.

5.11 Parking: Parking is prohibited in the following locations: Alongside taxiways (except Taxiway 4), runways, test tracks, Broome Road from Runway 6 Approach Zone eastward, and further than 15 feet from the tree line in the Jump Circle. No parking on South or North Boundary roads is permitted unless vehicle is parked completely off the roadway. No parking is permitted in any wildlife cover plots. All roads shall be kept clear for emergency vehicles.

5.12 Pickerel and Bass Lake. Pickerel Lake is CLOSED to waterfowl hunting due to its proximity to the Test Runway. Bass Lake is CLOSED to waterfowl hunting in October due

to its proximity to the Nature Trail. Bass Lake will be open to waterfowl hunting after 8 November.

5.13 Deer Tag: All hunters must comply with all NJ Division of Fish and Wildlife regulations regarding tagging/reporting of harvested deer.

5.14 Bass Lake Nature Trail: No hunting is permitted within 200 feet of the nature trail around Bass Lake. The trail will be closed from 8 November to 31 January, except on Sundays. Signs will be posted on the trailheads reflecting dates on which the trail is closed.

5.15 All hunters will wear a daylight fluorescent solid orange cap with no logo or printing on it and an outer garment consisting of not less than 200 square inches of fluorescent orange material, which must be visible from all sides when hunting upland game or deer with a shotgun or muzzleloader rifle.

5.16.1 Each hunter will be required to endorse the reverse side of the "Liability/Hold Harmless Agreement" (Enclosure 1) indicating he/she has read and understands the agreement.

6. FISHING

6.1 Purpose: The fishing laws and regulations of New Jersey and the following regulations will govern fishing on the Lakehurst section of JB MDL:

6.2 Permit: A base Fishing Permit indicating payment of appropriate fees is required to fish on JB MDL. It must be carried by the sportsman and worn in a conspicuous place on outer clothing while engaged in fishing. Annual permits expire on 31 December of each year and are good only from date sold to 31 December. The installation fishing permit purchased on i-Sportsman will be valid for the Lakehurst section of JB MDL, but access to Lakehurst will be still be restricted to individuals with base access cards or sponsored individuals. Permits purchased at Lakehurst will also be valid on all other sections of JB MDL. Fishing permits are not transferable and the fisherman must personally apply for the permit. All off-post children 15 and under who are not from the JB MDL Lakehurst Rod and Gun Club or military dependents must be accompanied by an adult who possesses a valid JB MDL fishing permit. All installation hunting and fishing permits shall be purchased from the i-Sportsman website at <https://www.jbmdl.isportsman.net>. For further information, telephone 732-323-2911. Scout groups camping at Bass Lake will not be required to buy base fishing permits to fish at Bass Lake during a camping trip to JB MDL. For those 16 years and older, New Jersey State licenses are still required. State licenses and base permits are still required for scouts 16 and older and their leaders if they want to fish at any areas other than Bass Lake. No base permits will be required on New Jersey Free Fishing Days, but the free fishing on these days will only be open to immediate family members (spouses and children) of active military and JB MDL civilian employees.

6.3 License and Stamps: Fishermen are NOT EXEMPT from the requirement of any federal or state laws governing licenses and stamps while on the federal reservation, with the exception of the New Jersey Trout Stamp, which is NOT required while fishing on JB MDL. Fishing licenses, fishing permits, and passes shall be shown to Department of Air Force (DAF) Police/NJ Division of Fish and Wildlife personnel upon request.

6.4 Checking In/Out: Fishermen must check-in and out at the Fishing Registration Board located at Building 525. Legal fishing times are one hour before sunrise until one

hour after sunset. All fishermen shall sign out no more than 30 minutes before they start or 30 minutes after they finish fishing. Failure to sign-in/out may lead to revocation of fishing privileges. Refer to enclosure 3 for location of buildings and authorized fishing areas.

6.5 Species Caught: All fishermen must report species and location of all fish caught and kept at the Fishing Registration Board, Building 525, on the form provided. This data will be used for future fisheries management action. Failure to comply shall result in penalties outlined in enclosure 2.

6.6 Sponsored Fishing: Due to increased security requirements, public fishing (off post individuals) on the Lakehurst section of JB MDL is limited to those who can be sponsored by JB MDL personnel with daily access badges to the base. The “sponsored fishing” will be conducted as follows:

6.6.1 Sponsors: Any person with a DoD badge that grants him/her access to JB MDL may sponsor members of the general public (“guests”) to fish on JB MDL. Sponsors must be at least 18 years old. A qualifying individual may sponsor a maximum of five guests per year.

6.6.2 Guest Permit: A guest hunter may purchase their permit from i-Sportsman after digitally signing the Liability/Hold Harmless Agreement. Purchase of hunting permit does not allow base access without appropriate sponsorship. Any sponsored guest must be a United States citizen and provide proof of same. State fishing licenses are still required for all those 16 to 69 years old before they may purchase a base fishing permit. The guest must personally endorse the Liability/Hold Harmless Agreement (Enclosure 1) if they are 18 or older. Parents or legal guardians must sign for minors.

6.6.3 Fishing Procedure: The sponsor must meet the guest at the front gate and accompany the guest at all times when the guest goes fishing on JB MDL. If the guest is found fishing without the sponsor being present, both parties will be subject to the penalties as outlined in Enclosure 2.

6.6.4 Base Access: The base fishing permit is NOT an access pass to the base. It only allows the guest to fish legally on JB MDL. Access to the Lakehurst section of the base will be granted only if the sponsor accompanies the guest. All persons already having access to JB MDL may continue to buy base fishing permits in the usual manner.

6.7 Specific Areas:

6.7.1 Island Pond: No boats are permitted from 1 March until 15 June. Fishing will be closed on days of stocking and whenever NO FISHING signs are posted. If the lake is not posted, fishing will resume 0800 the day after stocking.

6.7.2 Clubhouse and Bass Lakes: Use of live bait in Clubhouse and Bass Lakes is prohibited between 15 April and 15 June. Artificial lures only. Exception: The live bait ban will not be in force on the New Jersey Free Fishing Days. All bass must be released back into Clubhouse Lake during this time frame. Bass Lake is strictly “catch and release” for largemouth bass all year-round. Fishermen are responsible for reading and obeying the signs posted at the lakes!

6.7.3 Manapaqua and Ridgeway Brooks: Fishing in areas off North and South perimeter roads in the Manapaqua and Ridgeway brooks is authorized for military personnel, military dependents, and civilian employees.

6.8 Trout Stocked Ponds: Fishing is prohibited on the day prior to opening of trout season and whenever NO FISHING signs are posted.

6.9 New Jersey Limits: All fishermen on JB MDL will abide by New Jersey size limits and creel limits unless notice is otherwise posted at lakes and streams. Note that the daily limit for trout is four, NOT six. Sportsmen who reached their creel limit must stop fishing for the day on any lake that has been stocked with trout.

6.10 New Jersey Duck Season: Clubhouse Lake will be closed to fishing during duck season. North of Route 70 in New Jersey, duck season duration is approximately four weeks. Bass Lake will be closed to fishing from 8 November until the end of the duck hunting season. Appropriate notice will be posted at the Fishing Registration Board at Building 525.

6.11 Each sportsman will be required to endorse the “Liability//Hold Harmless Agreement” (Enclosure 1) indicating he/she has read and understands the agreement.

7. BOATING

7.1 Boating is permitted on Bass Lake, Clubhouse Lake, Pickerel Lake, Rainbow Pond and Island Pond.

7.2 Battery-powered electric trolling motors are the only type of motors permitted on any lake, pond, or waterway within the Lakehurst section of JB MDL. No gas engines or gas tank of any kind will be attached to a boat using base waters.

7.3 All watercraft are required to have safety equipment as prescribed by the New Jersey Police Boating Manual. One personal flotation device (PFD) per occupant is required in all watercraft at all times. All occupants under age 16 must be wearing their PFD in all watercraft at all times.

8. VIOLATIONS

8.1 The JB MDL Police and their deputies will have the authority to cite individuals violating provisions for this instruction, New Jersey law and federal law. A summary of administrative violations and penalties is attached as Enclosure 2.

8.2 Administrative

8.2.1 Violations appearing in JB MDL Instruction 32-7064 also apply in the Lakehurst section for hunting/fishing.

8.2.1.1 Lakehurst section specific hunting violations are as follows:

Hunters will sign-out of the field not later than 60 minutes after the end of the legal hunting time for that day unless they have notified the person checking the list at Building 525 that they are out tracking a deer or delayed due to field dressing and pulling a deer out of the woods. The penalty for this violation is: Warning (1st)

Offense), 30 Day Suspension (2nd Offense) and 60 Day Suspension (3rd Offense).

8.3 Enforcement

8.3.1 The 87th Security Forces Squadron (SFS) will cite offenders in writing.

8.3.2 The 87 SFS will notify the Natural Resources Manager of the date, time and type of violation committed and the name of the offender.

8.3.3 The offender's hunting or fishing privilege will be suspended immediately with the exception of violations with a first time offense of a warning.

8.4 Appeal Process

8.4.1 Only Administrative violations may be appealed.

8.4.2 The offender has seven days after receiving a citation from the SFS to request a review of the circumstances of the incident.

8.4.3 The appeal must be in writing and delivered in person to the Natural Resources Manager.

8.4.4 The appeal must include information relevant to the case that may overturn the citation and designated penalty.

8.4.5 The Natural Resources Manager will have no more than seven business days to arrange a meeting with a 87 SFS representative, the offender and himself to review the case.

8.4.6 The result of the meeting will be sent in writing to the FSC Flight Chief.

In consideration for the privilege of participation in Joint Base McGuire/Dix/Lakehurst (JB MDL) hunting, trapping, scouting and fishing activities, as applicable and as a condition incident to the issuance of a permit for these activities, I do hereby release and agree to forever hold harmless the United States Government and the authorized agents and officials of the aforementioned military installation. I understand that participation in these activities may subject me to potentially hazardous circumstances. Due to these conditions, whether hidden or obvious that might exist, I forever discharge and hold harmless JB MDL and the United States Government from all claims, resulting in any loss, injury or death occurring while hunting, trapping, fishing or boating on JB MDL. I also discharge the officials and agents associated with JB MDL. The conditions referred to but are not limited to include aircraft, vehicles, jet sleds, duds and mines, falling into holes, barbed wire, tripping, falling and drowning. The provisions contained herein shall be binding on behalf of heirs, assigns, personal representatives, executors, guardians, estates and me.

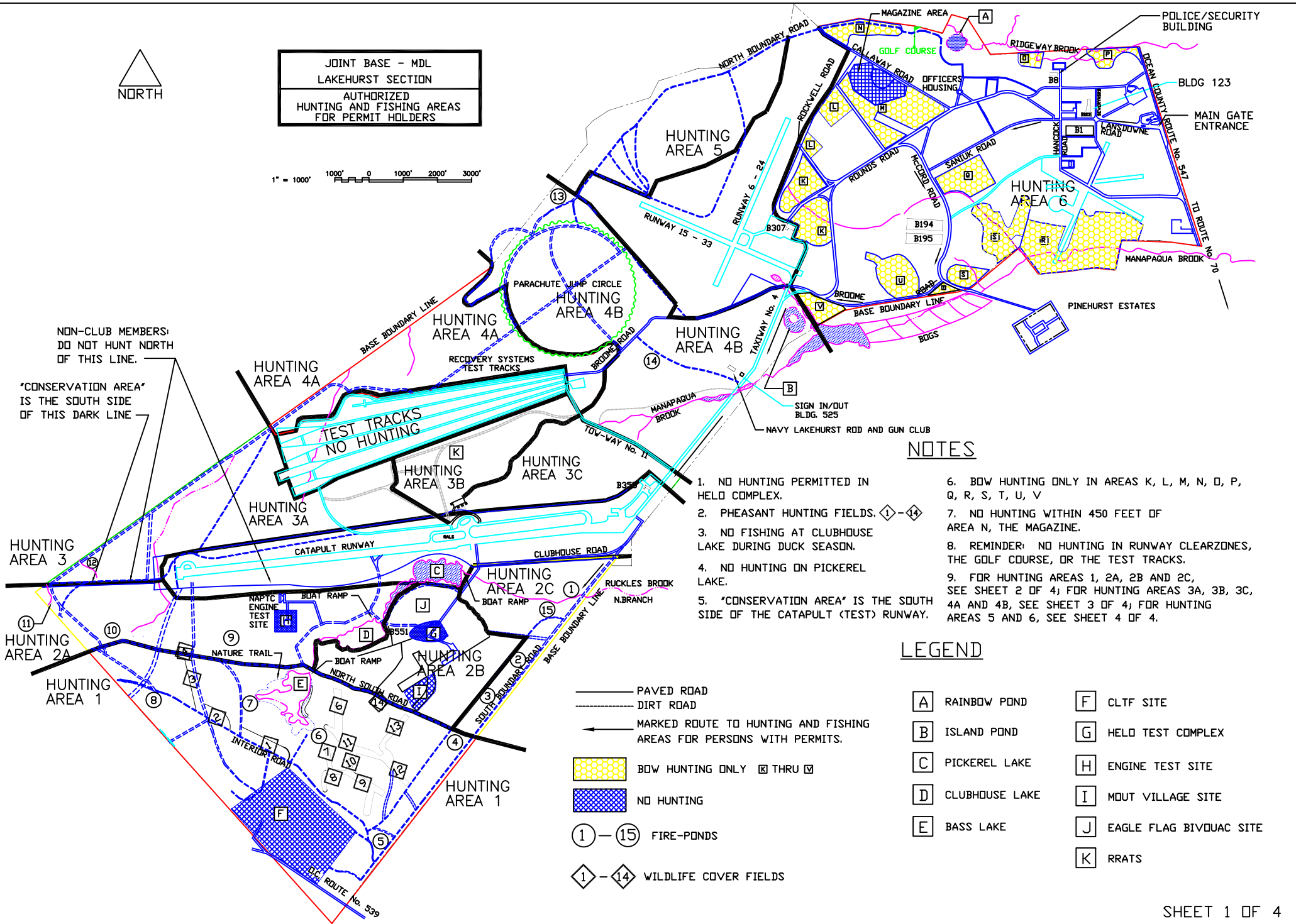

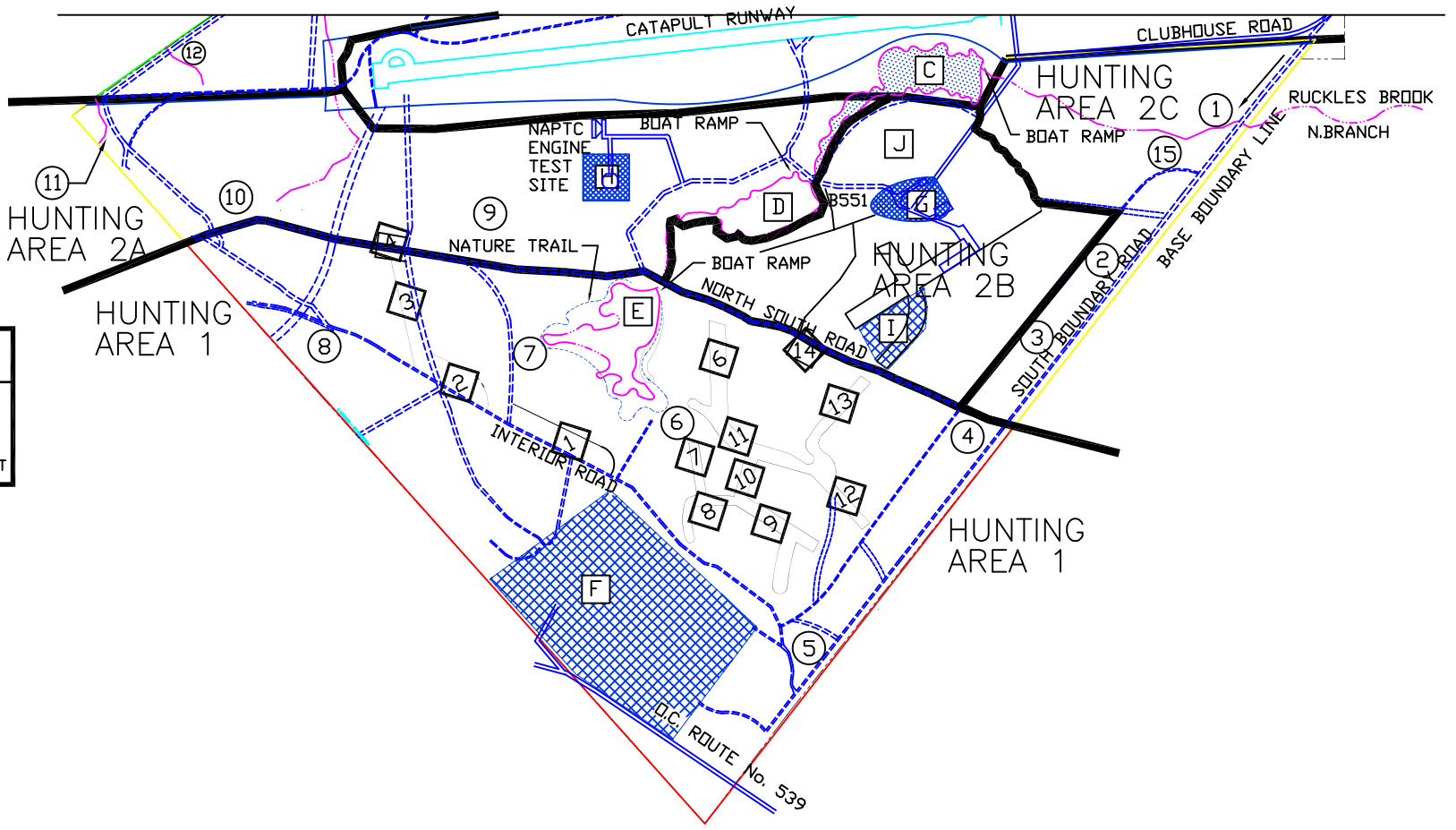

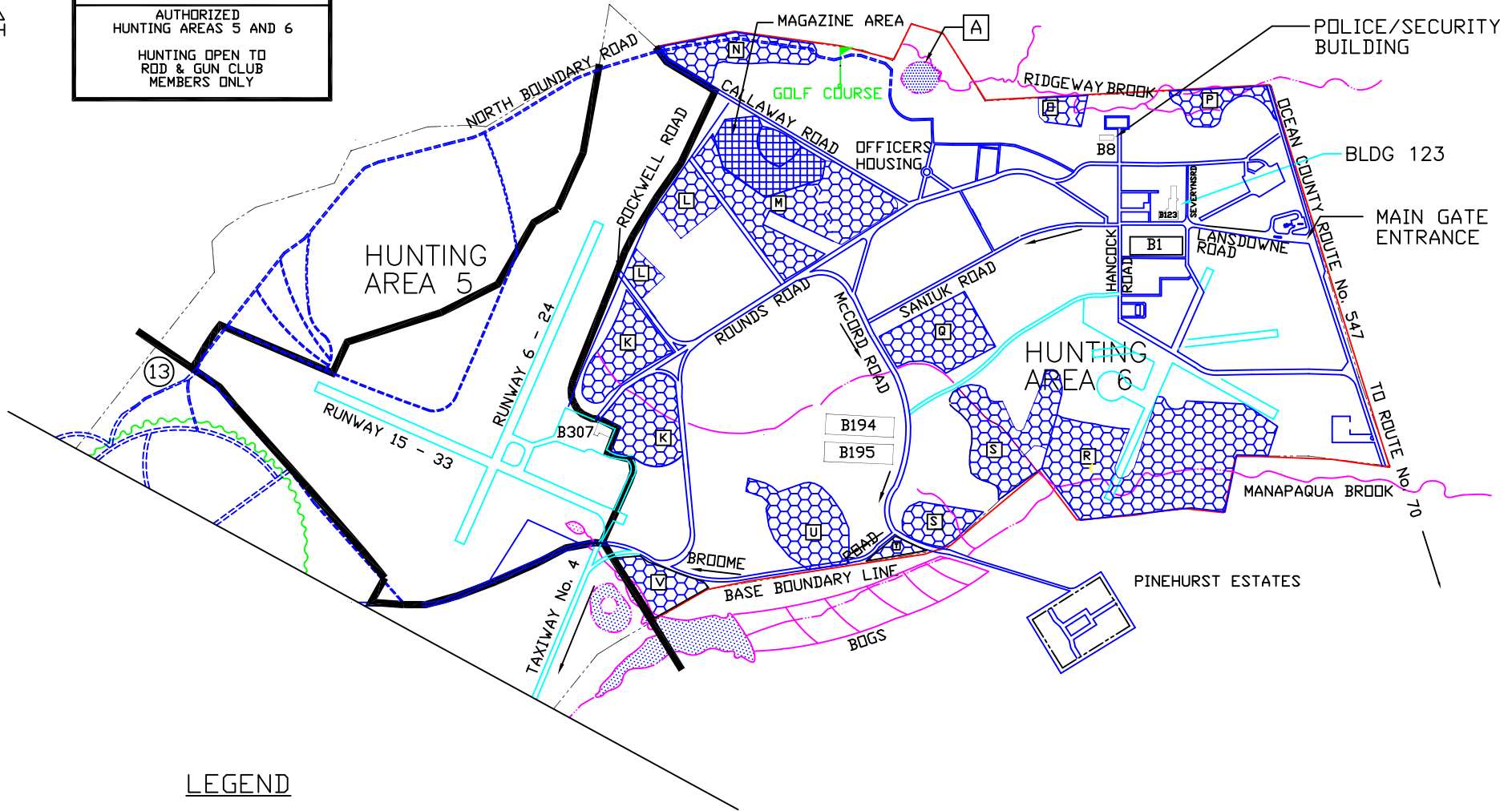
